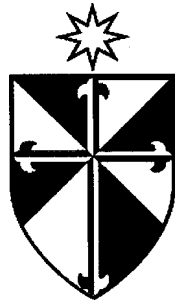

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ST DOMINIC'S CATHOLIC COLLEGE YEAR 13 UNIFORM 2025

Yr 13 may wear the Yr 7-12 uniform in its entirety, with optional skirt.

OR

After Yr 12 consultation in November 2024, and key staff input, Yr 13 may wear instead:

The Yr 13 regulation **skirt**. (No long undergarments to ever be visible).

- The regulation school blouse.
- The regulation college blazer.
- All optional: Regulation college trousers; the regulation college jersey or the regulation college senior school cardigan or the regulation college black jacket with crest; and the college hat. A plain black scarf or the new college scarf in Terms 2 and 3 only.
- For formal occasions the Yr 13 skirt or regulation trousers are worn with the college blazer or formal cultural attire is optional with the college skirt or regulation trousers.
- The optional college hoody is worn only with PE or sports uniform.

A choice of **footwear** from:

Sandals:

- The Yr 7-12 regulation Roman sandals OR A plain black leather sandal with a compulsory backstrap for health and safety reasons.
- The sole is plain black or earth-coloured. Birkenstocks **with backstraps** are acceptable.
- No patent leather.
- No bling/rhinestones etc.
- No coloured stitching.
- No jandals or jandal-type sandals/footwear or slides are permitted.

Shoes: Fully black, plain leather shoes with:

- No bling
- Black upper and sole
- Not patent leather nor suede
- No canvas
- Not boots, ankle boots or high tops.

These shoes outlined above may be:

- *lace-up* style (including black sole, black stitching and black laces) or
- plain *moccasin style* style (including black sole and black stitching; may have horse-bits and/or black tassels) or
- plain *ballet flats* (including black sole).

Shoes may be worn only with plain black ankle socks (Terms 1 to 4) or plain black tights (Terms 2 and 3).

For health and safety requirements, shoes must be worn in science laboratories and technology rooms.

Year 13 who are unable to work within these footwear rules will be required to wear regulation Yr 7 to 12 school shoes.

Makeup, hair and jewellery:

- The college's uniform policy as on the school website applies to Year 13 unless noted otherwise in this document.
- Year 13's may wear subtle, tasteful makeup and subtle nail varnish, subtle short acrylic or gel nails. French tips are acceptable. "Short" means no more than 5mm from the finger tip.
- No eyelash extensions or false eyelashes allowed.
- They may wear one bracelet and one ring on each hand, or two bracelets on one hand and no bracelet on the other with one ring on each hand.
- Up to two pairs of small i.e up to 5mm, stud earrings are permitted; earrings are worn only in each lower ear lobe. Hoop earrings and sleepers are not permitted.
- One subtle, visible necklace and/or cultural taonga.
- Hair must be fully off the face at all times and tidy.
- Hair is tied fully back or fully up for formal occasions.

Interpretation

The final decision re interpretation about the uniform, including the Year 13 uniform, rests with the Principal. No dispute will be entered into.
